ABOUT NYEF:

National Youth Equity Forum (NYEF) is a membership based collective of/for socially excluded young people striving to promote leadership and equal opportunity for youth towards achieving their social, education, economic and cultural rights with a vision to build a just and socially inclusive society for all.

Currently, NYEF evolving as a membership based youth led movement consisting over 8000 members across structured and organised youth led collectives as Bihar Ambedkar Students' Forum (BASF), Uttar Pradesh Youth Equity Forum (UPYEF) and Delhi Youth Equity Forum (DYEF). NYEF vision is to nurture young leadership among socially excluded communities i.e. Dalit, Adivasi, Muslim, Nomadic Tribes & De-Notified Tribes, voice out their concerns of growing inequalities and aligned together for community based actions to transform and influence their self, society and governance!

On the principle of educate, agitate and organize, around 150 fellows and thousands of motivated cadres across states is able to push the agenda of social equity & inclusion and act in the area of improving transition in to tertiary education, health (SRHR), employability and entrepreneurial education on ground by keeping the national and global goals of "Leave No One Behind" in the frame of SDGs and Constitutional mandate of promoting equity, liberty, fraternity and justice for all!

Highlights of Jul-Sep 2024

- A new batch of 30 youth undergoing Entrance Readiness Programme for SNU/CUET/APU/TISS and provided mentorship under Higher Education Link Programme (HELP)
- 7th Batch of Ambedkar Fellowship launched, outreach over 400 youth in Patna, Jamui, and Araria districts, 169 applications received, and 80 fellows are finally onboarded.
- "Navoday Ab Door Nahi" 47 first generation children are facilitated to apply for Jawahar Navoday Vidhyalaya (JNV) and mentor/coaching is being provided through Ambedkar Fellows.
- 2 Fellows joined Shiv Nadar University (SNU) and TISS Mumbai campus for their PG courses
- Two fellows selected for Go Rurban Camp Threads of Tradition.
- Two fellows selected for the Changeloom Youth Leadership in Climate Action program.
- On International Youth Day, a library committee for Vyaktitva Vikas Kendra (VVK) consisting of 8
 members was formed with 150 youth, through a democratic election process.
- The inauguration of the Savitribai Phule Library, in collaboration with fellows, the committee, and PRIs members, was organized on the occasion of Periyar Day, 17th September 2024
 - Four fellows have joined free courses provided by Lighthouse (organization).
 - Three fellows have applied for the UNICEF Yuwaah program.

On-Ground Voices

Govind Kumar, from Aurangabad, Bihar, belongs to a marginalized community with limited education awareness.

He is the first youth from his community pursuing higher education, supported by BASF since 2023. Govind actively promotes education among local youth and was recently selected for a Digital Democracy program, where he learned to create a documentary on community issues. He continues to advance in his journey to make a difference.




Delhi Youth Equity Forum - DYEF



- Nine weekly session on (A Behavioral contract, Report making, Play for Peace, Community action Project about5W (why, what. when. where. Whom), Lighthouse Courses Orientation, Reflection and feedback of Training, Redesigning CAP, Trust building and creating safe space, discrimination and inequality through performance-based activities, practice role-playing for the performance) were organized with ASPIRE fellows and the DYEF network, with each session involving 35 participants, reaching a total of 315 vouth.
- 20 fellows have prepared their Community Action Projects:- Promoting Mental and Emotional Well-being, Empowering Youth through Education and Awareness, Fostering Inclusivity and Environmental Responsibility:
- 3-Day Residential Training: Conducted a capacity building and training workshop for ASPIRE fellows.
- SMILE Internship: One fellow is actively participating in the SMILE internship program.

- A review of the previous month's activities and planning for the upcoming month was conducted with the secretariat and fellows.
- 2 fellow applied for Skill Development, leadership building, higher education in
- A survey on community issues was conducted, in which 20 fellows collectively completed 1,000 surveys.
- Fifteen fellows shared their one-year journey in the form of a story.
- A fellow named Sunny helped four YEF members get admission into M.Sc. Agriculture.

- 10 batches have been completed for SNU/CUET/APU.
- A senior Ambedkar fellow participated in the 12th BDC meetup, where they had the opportunity to learn and understand from 40 organizations.
- Under the "Navoday Ab Door Nahi" campaign running in BASF, forms for 47 children were filled out.
- Forms for 10 youth were filled out for the post-matric scholarship.

Upcoming Programmes:

- Annual Camapign to educate and facilitate youth to learn and practice constitutional values, "Sanvidhan Se Gantantra Nirmaan Abhiyaan" will be launched from November 26 to January 26, 2026
- As part of the "Shadi Samjhdari or Sajhedari " program, 10 married couples from 5 districts of Bihar will start 10 new business ventures using innovative approaches.
- A 3-day learning exposure and experience training will be organized at the state level with 100 fellows.
- An art and colors program "Hamar Kahani, Hamar Rang" will be conducted with 40 girls, along with their families and communities. The culmination of this program will include an exhibition and a mural display.
- A "My Day" event will be organized with 30 children from the marginalized community, at the community level. The event will include participation from all community members, where the progress and journey of the 30 fellows so far will be shared. This will be a significant day for the children.



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
